 Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Arizona, the House of Representatives concurring:

1. Article II, Constitution of Arizona, is proposed to be amended by adding section 36 as follows if approved by the voters and on proclamation of the Governor:

36. Right to secret ballot

SECTION 36. TO PRESERVE AND PROTECT THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT OF INDIVIDUALS TO VOTE BY SECRET BALLOT, WHERE LOCAL, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW REQUIRES ELECTIONS FOR PUBLIC OFFICES OR FOR BALLOT MEASURES, OR REQUIRES DESIGNATIONS OR AUTHORIZATIONS FOR EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATION, THE RIGHT OF INDIVIDUALS TO VOTE BY SECRET BALLOT SHALL BE GUARANTEED.

2. The Secretary of State shall submit this proposition to the voters at the next general election as provided by article XXI, Constitution of Arizona.
