Arizona's Workforce

Employment Report

In July the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Arizona increased one tenth of a percentage point to 8.3% after three consecutive months at 8.2%. The U.S. unemployment rate also increased by 0.1% to 8.3%. A year ago the Arizona rate was 9.6% and the U.S. rate was 9.1% (see figure 1).

Arizona lost 21,800 Nonfarm jobs in July, primarily from seasonal losses in State and Local Public Education within Government. Private Sector losses were also mostly seasonal. On average, over the last ten years ('02-'11) Arizona has lost 28,000 Nonfarm jobs (or -1.2%) in July. July's losses (-0.9%) were less than average for July in Arizona (see figure 2).

Private Sector losses (-0.3%) were less than half the historical ('02-'11) average for July (-0.7%). Meanwhile Government losses (-4.2%) were higher than average (-3.8%) for July. Government job losses in July were driven by Local (-15,900) and State (-900) Public Education as schools pared back staff during summer vacation time. State Government also posted losses in noneducation agencies in addition to the State Public Education losses while Local Government had gains in non-education jobs. Federal Government added 300 jobs over the month. Federal Government more typically posts job losses in July with a tenyear ('02-'11) average loss of 600 jobs.


The Private Sector has lost jobs every year in July since 1990 except in 2005 when it

gained 100 jobs. The Private Sector loss (-6,100 or -0.3%) in July 2012 was the smallest over-the-month loss in the last seven years. In the ten years before the recession ('98-'07), the Private Sector averaged a loss of 0.6%.

Over the Month by Industry Sector

Four of the eleven major sectors added jobs, two were flat, and five lost jobs in July (see figure 3).

Financial Activities added the most jobs (1,300) for the month. Most of the job gains in the sector were in Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (900). These gains were well above average for the sector, and may be related to recent increases in investor activity in the Arizona real estate



market and rentals associated with trade shows and other events in the state.

Manufacturing added 1,100 jobs. Most of the Manufacturing job gains were in Durable Goods (1,000). Nondurable Goods added 100 jobs. The net job gains in Manufacturing so far in 2012 (2,800) are well ahead of the same time frame for last year (500).

Construction was the next highest gaining sector for the month, adding 1,000 jobs. Specialty Trades added 1,500 jobs while Building Construction (-300) and Heavy Construction (-200) had job losses. Net job gains in Construction so far in 2012 (9,000) are greater than the same time period in 2011 (2,200).

Government losses were by far the highest of all the sectors (-15,700 jobs or -4.2%). Government job losses were heaviest in Local (-15,900) and State (-900) Public Education from summer vacation staff reductions. Local Education losses (-13.6%) were above the '02-'11 average (10.4%) while State Public Education losses (-2.4%) were below the ten-year average (-4.4%).

Leisure and Hospitality (LH) had the next highest number of over-the-month losses with 5,700 jobs lost. Losses in Leisure and Hospitality have occurred every July since 1990. The seasonal loss in July (-2.1%) was less than the '02-'11 average (-2.4%) for the sector. Most of the LH losses were in Food Services and Drinking Places (-4,100). Accommodation lost 900 jobs and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation lost 700 jobs.

Trade, Transportation, and Utilities (TTU) lost 1,700 jobs. The ten-year average for TTU was a loss of 1,500 jobs. A little over half the job losses in TTU were in Transportation and Warehousing (-900). The remaining TTU losses were in Wholesale Trade (-700) and Utilities (-100). Retail Trade was flat for the month.

Educational and Health Services (EHS) lost 1,600 jobs in July. Job losses in EHS are typical in July. The ten-year ('02-'11) average for EHS was a loss of 1,900 jobs, so these recent July losses were less than average. Within EHS, Private Educational Services losses (-1.3% or -700 jobs) were well below average (-4.9% or -1,900 jobs) while Health Care and Social Assistance losses (-0.3%) were a little more than the ten-year-average (0%) for the month.

Nine major sectors added jobs and two sectors posted losses for the net gain in employment (see figure 4).

Leading the way in employment gains, **Educational and Health Services** (EHS) added 11,100 jobs. Health Care accounted for over 70% (8,000) of the job gains within EHS.

The **Professional and Business Services** (PBS) sector was a close second to EHS in job gains, adding 10,900 jobs. Within PBS 10,800 jobs were added in Employment Services while Services to Buildings and Dwellings added 1,100. Offsetting losses in other PBS industries brought the PBS total gain to 10,900 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) had the next largest increase with 9,900 jobs added. Retail Trade accounted for 9,000 of the job gains within TTU. **Leisure and Hospitality** (LH) added 8,400 jobs. Food Services and Drinking Places added 8,500 jobs, while Accommodation lost 600 jobs. Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation added 500 jobs to the LH sector. **Construction** added 8,200 jobs, mostly in Specialty Trades (7,400). **Government** added 4,100 jobs with most gains from Local Public Education (3,400). Federal Government lost 500 jobs.

Financial Activities gained 3,900 jobs with 2,600 jobs coming from Real Estate and Rental and Leasing. **Manufacturing** added 2,400 jobs, with more gains in Durable Goods (1,400) than Nondurable Goods (1,000). **Natural Resources and Mining** added 200 jobs. **Information** (-100) and **Other Services** (-3,300) lost jobs.

Summary

Arizona's Nonfarm payroll employment declined by 21,800 jobs over the month. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased one tenth of a percentage point to 8.3% after three months at 8.2%. The U.S. unemployment rate also increased by a tenth of a percent to 8.3%. Total Nonfarm employment losses were the lowest for the month of July since 2005.

Both Government and the Private Sector typically have over-the-month losses in July. Private Sector losses (-6,100) were less than half the average for July while Government seasonal losses (-15,700) were higher than average. Four of the eleven major sectors added jobs, two were flat, and five lost jobs in July. Financial Activities (1,300), Manufacturing (1,100), and Construction (1,000) were the largest gainers. Government losses were by far the highest among the major sectors. Government losses were primarily from Local (-15,900) and State (-900) Public education as schools pared back staff for summer vacation. Leisure and Hospitality (-5,700), Trade, Transportation and Utilities (-1,700), and Education and Health Services (-1,600) were the other sectors with larger losses.

Over the year, Total Nonfarm employment added 55,700 jobs (2.4%). This is the second consecutive month for job gains above 2%. Job gains above 2% have not been seen in Arizona since early 2007. Private Sector job gains over the year were 2.6% in July. This was the fifth consecutive month of job gains above 2% in the Private Sector, with an average gain of 2.3% (46,600) between March and July 2012.

Nine major sectors had job gains, and two sectors had losses. The sectors that posted the largest gains were Education and Health Services (11,100), Professional and Business Services (10,900), Trade Transportation, and Utilities (9,900), Leisure and Hospitality (8,400), and Construction (8,200). Other Services lost 3,300 jobs and Information lost 100.
