
Mary Ann Dobras

John Hildebrand, Emeritus

John G. Hildebrand joined the faculty of the University of Arizona in Tucson in 1985 after serving as a faculty member at Harvard (1970-80) and Columbia (1980-85) Universities. He is Regents Professor of Neuroscience and Professor of Chemistry & Biochemistry, Entomology, and Molecular & Cellular Biology. He earned his baccalaureate degree at Harvard University (1964) and his Ph.D. (in biochemistry, 1969) at the Rockefeller University. He was founding Director of the ARL Division of Neurobiology at the University of Arizona (1985-2009) and subsequently founding Head of the Department of Neuroscience after the Division of Neurobiology became the Department of Neuroscience (2009-13).

Hildebrand and his coworkers study insect nervous systems, with a current focus on the neurobiology of the olfactory system and its roles in behavior as well as related areas of chemical and sensory ecology. This work teaches us about mechanisms that are common to vertebrate and invertebrate nervous systems and at the same time contributes to knowledge that will help alleviate the harm done by insects that are predators of the human food supply or vectors of disease. He is author of more than 220 peer-reviewed research papers and reviews and editor of five books.

Hildebrand is past president of several scientific societies, including the Association for Chemoreception Sciences (AChemS), International Society of Chemical Ecology, and the International Society for Neuroethology, and a frequent consultant to federal agencies, private foundations, and companies. Among his strongest interests is education at all levels, and in that connection he served for many years as chairman of the Board of Neuroscience Schools of the International Brain Research Organization (IBRO) and as a member of the Training Advisory Committee of the APA/ANDP/NIH Diversity Program in Neuroscience. He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences and currently serves as its Foreign Secretary, one of the five elected officers. He also is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Philosophical Society, and the German National Academy of Sciences 'Leopoldina'; a foreign member of the Norwegian Academy of Science and Letters and the Royal Norwegian Society of Sciences and Letters; an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Entomological Society (UK), and a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Entomological Society of America, and the International Society for Neuroethology. Among his other honors are an Einstein Professorship in the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Outstanding Service Award for Contributions to the Biological Sciences from the American Institute of Biological Sciences, the Silver Medal of the International Society of Chemical Ecology, the Founders Memorial Award of the Entomological Society of America, and a Max Planck Research Award and a Humboldt Research Prize from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation.

In addition to his extensive activities as an academic scientist, Hildebrand serves as a member of the Advisory Board of UAPresents (the performing arts presenting organization of the University of Arizona) and the Community Advisory Board of Arizona Public Media. In 2013 he was elected to membership in the Cosmos Club in Washington DC. For nearly thirty years until 1985, he enjoyed a parallel career as a free-lance professional musician in Boston and New York City. He is included in several versions of *Who's Who*.

Lynn Nadel, PhD

Dr. Lynn Nadel is the Regents' Professor Emeritus of psychology at the University of Arizona. Nadel specializes in memory and has investigated the role of the hippocampus in memory formation. Together with John O'Keefe, he coauthored the influential 1978 book *The Hippocampus as a Cognitive Map*, which defended the theory that the hippocampus learns and stores cognitive maps of portions of space. He later advanced the multiple trace theory that the hippocampus is always involved in storage and retrieval of episodic memory, but that semantic memory can be established in the neocortex.

Nadel received a Ph.D. from McGill University in 1967 and joined

the faculty of the University of Arizona in 1985, where he currently serves as director of the Cognition and Neural Systems Program. Nadel, together with John O'Keefe, received the 2006 Grawemeyer Award for their work in identifying the brain's mapping system. He was named recipient of a 2019 William James Fellow Award from the Association for Psychological Science for his contributions to cognitive psychology. From 2007 to 2016, Nadel was the founding editor-in-chief of the scientific journal, *Wiley Interdisciplinary Reviews: Cognitive Science*.
