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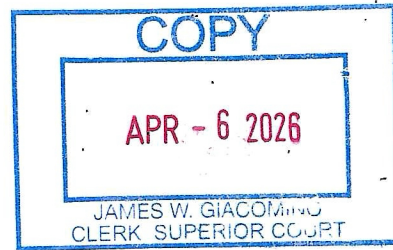

**VERIFIED COMPLAINT CHALLENGING CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS,
REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED HEARING,
AND APPLICATION FOR DECLARATORY AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

Plaintiff alleges:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. This is an expedited election challenge under A.R.S. § 16-351(B) to the nomination of Defendant Alma C. Hernandez for the office of Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20.
2. Arizona law expressly authorizes an elector to challenge a candidate for any reason relating to qualifications for the office sought as prescribed by law, including failure to fully pay fines, penalties, or judgments as prescribed in A.R.S. § 16-311.
3. Arizona law further provides that, except where the liability is being appealed, the filing officer shall not accept the nomination paper of a candidate for state or local office if the candidate is liable for an aggregate of \$1,000 or more in unpaid fines, penalties, late fees, or administrative or civil judgments, including interest or costs, that were not fully satisfied at the time of filing and that arose from failure to comply with or enforcement of Arizona campaign finance law. A.R.S. § 16-311(J).
4. Plaintiff alleges that, at the time Defendant Hernandez filed her nomination paper for the 2026 Democratic primary for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20, she was liable for more than \$1,000 in unpaid campaign finance liabilities arising under Title 16, Chapter 6.
5. Records produced by the Arizona Secretary of State reflect that, on August 5, 2022, the Secretary of State issued a Reasonable Cause Notice – Failure to File Campaign Finance Report concerning Alma for Arizona, Filer ID 201800416, identified as Matter No. SOS-FTF-2022-073, relating to the committee's failure to file its 2022 Quarter 1

report due April 15, 2022, and transmitted that matter to the Arizona Attorney General for appropriate action.

6. Plaintiff further alleges, on information and belief, that additional appealable enforcement or judicial records may exist, or may have existed at the relevant time, reflecting qualifying unpaid campaign finance liabilities attributable to Defendant Hernandez in her political or electoral capacity. Plaintiff requested such records from the Arizona Secretary of State but did not receive them before the challenge deadline.
7. Independently and alternatively, Plaintiff alleges that the statutory liabilities reflected in the public campaign finance record arose by operation of law and were not extinguished or suspended merely because complete enforcement records had not yet been produced to Plaintiff before the challenge deadline.
8. Because the conditions set forth in A.R.S. § 16-311(J) existed at the time of filing, the Arizona Secretary of State lacked authority to accept Defendant Hernandez's nomination paper. Plaintiff therefore seeks an order declaring Defendant Hernandez ineligible to appear on the ballot and directing the appropriate election officials not to print, certify, or count her name for that office.

II. JURISDICTION, VENUE, AND TIMELINESS

9. This Court has jurisdiction under A.R.S. § 16-351, which provides for a superior court action challenging a candidate's nomination and requires expedited adjudication.
10. Venue is proper in this Court because this action concerns the preparation of ballots for Legislative District 20 in Pima County and because the Pima County Board of Supervisors and Pima County Recorder are indispensable parties under A.R.S. § 16-351(C).
11. This action is timely. The statutory filing deadline for legislative candidates for the 2026 primary election was March 23, 2026 at 5:00 p.m., and the Arizona Secretary of State identified April 6, 2026 at 5:00 p.m. as the deadline to file a legal challenge under A.R.S. § 16-351.
12. Under A.R.S. § 16-351(C), the candidate, the filing officer, and the board of supervisors and recorder of each county responsible for preparing the ballot are indispensable parties to this action. A.R.S. § 16-351(D) further requires service immediately after filing and in no event more than twenty-four hours after filing, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays.

III. PARTIES

13. Plaintiff is, and at all relevant times has been, a qualified elector of the State of Arizona and Legislative District 20.
14. Defendant Alma C. Hernandez is an individual who filed nomination papers as a candidate for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20.
15. Defendant Adrian Fontes is the duly elected Arizona Secretary of State and is the filing officer responsible for accepting nomination papers for state legislative candidates.

16. Defendant Pima County Board of Supervisors is responsible for ballot preparation and election administration within Pima County.
17. Defendant Pima County Recorder is responsible for election-related functions including ballot preparation, processing, and certification within Pima County.

IV. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

18. Defendant Hernandez filed nomination papers with the Arizona Secretary of State to appear on the ballot for the 2026 Democratic primary election for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20.
19. On information and belief, Defendant Hernandez executed and filed a nomination paper and declaration of qualification stating that she had no final, outstanding judgments against her of an aggregate of \$1,000 or more arising from failure to comply with or enforcement of campaign finance law. Plaintiff alleges that this declaration does not narrow or displace the broader filing prohibition imposed by A.R.S. § 16-311(J), which applies to unpaid fines, penalties, late fees, and administrative or civil judgments in any combination.
20. Arizona law imposes mandatory campaign finance reporting requirements on candidate committees under Title 16, Chapter 6.
21. Arizona law also imposes late filing penalties for required campaign finance reports that are not timely filed. The Arizona Secretary of State's public campaign finance materials state that a committee that fails to timely file a report must pay the filing officer a penalty of \$10 for each day the filing is late during the first 15 days after the filing deadline and \$25 for each subsequent day, and that penalties accrue until the late report is filed.
22. Automated campaign finance notices sent by the Arizona Secretary of State further state that filing reminders are sent only as a courtesy, that a committee's action or inaction with respect to such notices does not release it from its legal obligation to file required campaign finance reports or future reports, and that reports filed after the close of the filing period are subject to mandatory late filing penalties.
23. These notices support the conclusion that campaign finance reporting obligations and late-fee liabilities arise by operation of law and are not dependent on whether reminder emails are received or acted upon.
24. Public records available through the Arizona Secretary of State's See the Money / Beacon portal reflect a consistent pattern of late filings and assessed penalties associated with Defendant Hernandez's campaign committees.

Committee 1 – Filer ID: 201800416

25. Public records in the Arizona Secretary of State's See the Money / Beacon portal reflect that Defendant Hernandez is listed as the candidate, chairperson, and treasurer for the committee "Alma for Arizona" (Filer ID: 201800416).
26. The portal reflects at least \$20,355 in assessed fines tied to late campaign finance reports filed by that committee between 2018 and 2022.

27. These include, but are not limited to, the following assessed penalties:

- a. 2018 Post-Primary Election: \$90
- b. 2018 Pre-General Election: \$30
- c. 2018 Post-General Election (Q4): \$30
- d. 2019 Cumulative Report: \$10
- e. 2020 Quarter 1: \$40
- f. 2020 Post-Primary Election: \$90
- g. 2020 Post-General Election (Q4): \$40
- h. 2021 Cumulative Report: \$1,500
- i. 2022 Quarter 1: \$2,875
- j. 2022 Quarter 2: \$600
- k. 2022 Pre-Primary Election: \$725
- l. 2022 Post-Primary Election: \$5,675
- m. 2022 Pre-General Election: \$5,325
- n. 2022 Post-General Election (Q4): \$3,325

28. In addition, the portal reflects that the following reports appear still unfiled and late, though no assessed fine amount is presently shown in the materials reviewed by Plaintiff:

- a. 2023 Cumulative Report
- b. 2024 Quarter 1
- c. 2024 Quarter 2
- d. 2024 Pre-Primary Election
- e. 2024 Post-Primary Election
- f. 2024 Pre-General Election
- g. 2024 Post-General Election (Q4)
- h. 2025 Cumulative Report

29. These additional unfiled and late reports may reflect additional unresolved liability, though Plaintiff does not include them in the confirmed \$20,355 total absent further official documentation.

30. Records produced by the Secretary of State further show that, with respect to this same committee, the Secretary of State issued a Reasonable Cause Notice – Failure to File Campaign Finance Report on August 5, 2022, identified as Exhibit 2. Secretary of State Reasonable Cause Notice, concerning the committee’s failure to file its 2022 Quarter 1 report due April 15, 2022, and referred that matter to the Attorney General under A.R.S. § 16-937(C).

Committee 2 – Filer ID: 101373

31. The portal also reflects that Defendant Hernandez is listed as the candidate, chairperson, and treasurer for “Alma Hernandez for State Representative - District 20” (Filer ID: 101373).
32. This committee reflects multiple late filings, including the following:
 - a. 2022 Pre-Organization Report: 10 days late
 - b. 2024 Quarter 2: 17 days late
 - c. 2024 Pre-Primary Election: 12 days late
 - d. 2024 Post-General Election (Q4): 1 day late
33. Although this committee appears more current overall than Committee 1, its late filing history is relevant to whether Defendant Hernandez had ongoing or unresolved campaign finance liabilities at the time of filing in 2026.

Committee 3 – Filer ID: 101952

34. The portal also reflects that Defendant Hernandez is listed as the candidate for her current State Senate campaign committee, “Alma for Arizona” (Filer ID: 101952 / Filer Type: Candidate).
35. Based on the portal records reviewed by Plaintiff, this current committee appears current, with reports filed on time and no accrued fees presently shown.
36. The apparent compliance of the current State Senate committee does not itself resolve the legal question under A.R.S. § 16-311(J).
37. The relevant question is whether, at the time of filing, Defendant Hernandez was already liable for an aggregate of \$1,000 or more in unpaid campaign finance liabilities arising under Title 16, Chapter 6, including liabilities tied to prior committees in which she served as candidate, chairperson, and treasurer.
38. Plaintiff previously requested records from the Arizona Attorney General concerning any referral relating to Defendant Hernandez and was advised that the Attorney General had not received such a referral from the Secretary of State and had no responsive records. Records later produced by the Arizona Secretary of State, however, include the August 5, 2022 referral packet described above concerning Alma for Arizona, Filer ID 201800416.
39. Plaintiff does not allege that a 2018 complaint involving a late pre-primary filing and an independent expenditure issue remains unresolved. The 2018 records produced by the Secretary of State reflect that the complaint was dismissed without prejudice after the late report was filed and the respondents’ remedial actions rendered further enforcement moot.

V. LEGAL FRAMEWORK

40. A.R.S. § 16-311(J) provides that the filing officer shall not accept a nomination paper for state or local office if the candidate is liable for an aggregate of \$1,000 or more in unpaid fines, penalties, late fees, or administrative or civil judgments, including interest or costs,

that were not fully satisfied at the time of filing and that arose from failure to comply with or enforcement of Title 16, Chapter 6, unless the liability is being appealed.

41. The statutory language "shall not accept" is mandatory, not discretionary.
42. A.R.S. § 16-351(B) expressly authorizes an elector to challenge a candidate for qualifications-related reasons prescribed by law, including failure to fully pay fines, penalties, or judgments as prescribed in § 16-311.
43. The Arizona Secretary of State's campaign finance guidance states that, for purposes of § 16-311(J), disqualifying liabilities must be reflected in an order issued by an enforcement or judicial officer, that the filing officer is not required to calculate disqualification from raw or unsubstantiated portal data, and that the operative question is whether the candidate is subject to an appealable order for \$1,000 or more in unpaid qualifying liabilities.
44. Plaintiff acknowledges that current Secretary of State guidance frames the issue in terms of an appealable enforcement or judicial order.
45. However, Plaintiff further alleges that the statutory text itself does not state that liability exists only upon the issuance of a separate enforcement or judicial order, and that the Court must ultimately interpret and apply the statute enacted by the Legislature.
46. Plaintiff therefore pleads both:
 - a. that Defendant Hernandez was disqualified if one or more appealable enforcement or judicial orders existed and remained unpaid at the time of filing; and
 - b. in the alternative, that Defendant Hernandez was disqualified because her qualifying campaign finance liabilities arose by operation of law and remained unpaid at the time of filing, whether or not the Secretary of State had yet produced complete responsive enforcement records to Plaintiff before the challenge deadline.

VI. ALLEGATIONS ON INFORMATION AND BELIEF

47. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and on that basis alleges, that at the time Defendant Hernandez filed her nomination papers for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20:
 - a. one or more appealable enforcement or judicial orders may have existed reflecting qualifying unpaid campaign finance liabilities attributable to Defendant Hernandez in her political or electoral capacity;
 - b. those liabilities arose from failure to comply with or enforcement of Title 16, Chapter 6;
 - c. those liabilities exceeded \$1,000 in the aggregate;
 - d. those liabilities were not fully satisfied; and
 - e. those liabilities were not under appeal.
48. Plaintiff sought public records from the Arizona Secretary of State relevant to this issue but did not receive complete responsive records before the filing of this Complaint.
49. To the extent no final order or additional appealable order is produced before the Court's expedited consideration of this matter, Plaintiff alleges in the alternative that the public

record itself demonstrates that Defendant Hernandez was liable for an aggregate of more than \$1,000 in unpaid campaign finance penalties at the time of filing and that A.R.S. § 16-311(J) applies by its terms.

50. Despite the public record of substantial unpaid campaign finance liabilities reflected in the See the Money / Beacon portal, and despite the 2022 formal enforcement action described above, the Arizona Secretary of State accepted Defendant Hernandez's nomination papers.

VII. COUNT ONE

STATUTORY DISQUALIFICATION UNDER A.R.S. § 16-311(J)

51. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all preceding paragraphs.
52. At the time Defendant Hernandez filed her nomination papers, she was liable for campaign finance penalties, late fees, fines, and/or related liabilities in an aggregate amount greater than \$1,000.
53. Those liabilities arose from failure to comply with or enforcement of Arizona campaign finance law under Title 16, Chapter 6.
54. Those liabilities had not been fully satisfied at the time of filing.
55. Those liabilities were not under appeal.
56. Under A.R.S. § 16-311(J), the Arizona Secretary of State therefore lacked authority to accept Defendant Hernandez's nomination papers.
57. Defendant Hernandez was consequently statutorily disqualified from appearing on the ballot for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20.

VIII. COUNT TWO

QUALIFICATIONS CHALLENGE UNDER A.R.S. § 16-351(B)

58. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all preceding paragraphs.
59. A.R.S. § 16-351(B) expressly authorizes this Court to adjudicate a challenge based on failure to fully pay fines, penalties, or judgments as prescribed in § 16-311.
60. Because Defendant Hernandez had not fully satisfied the qualifying liabilities described above, Plaintiff is entitled to judicial relief declaring Defendant Hernandez ineligible and ordering that her name not appear on the ballot.

IX. COUNT THREE

LIABILITY ARISING BY OPERATION OF LAW

61. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all preceding paragraphs.
62. Arizona campaign finance reporting obligations and late filing penalties arise by operation of law.

63. The Arizona Secretary of State's own automated notices state that filing reminders are merely a courtesy, that legal filing obligations exist regardless of notice, and that late-filed reports are subject to mandatory daily penalties.
64. The public campaign finance record reflects that Defendant Hernandez's committees incurred substantial late filing penalties well in excess of the statutory threshold.
65. To interpret A.R.S. § 16-311(J) as requiring a separate enforcement order before any candidate can be "liable" would permit administrative delay or incomplete record production to defeat the statute's mandatory filing prohibition.
66. In the alternative to Plaintiff's allegation that qualifying appealable orders existed, Plaintiff alleges that Defendant Hernandez was "liable" within the plain meaning of A.R.S. § 16-311(J) because the unpaid campaign finance penalties had already accrued by operation of law and remained unsatisfied at the time of filing.

X. REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED HEARING

67. Under A.R.S. § 16-351(A), this matter must be heard and decided on an expedited basis.
68. Plaintiff requests that the Court set this matter for hearing at the earliest available time and enter such scheduling and service orders as necessary to ensure compliance with the statutory timetable.

XI. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this Court:

1. Accept jurisdiction over this action;
2. Set an expedited hearing pursuant to A.R.S. § 16-351;
3. Enter judgment declaring that Defendant Alma C. Hernandez was ineligible to file nomination papers for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20, under A.R.S. § 16-311(J);
4. Order Defendant Adrian Fontes, in his official capacity as Arizona Secretary of State, to reject, invalidate, or otherwise not certify Defendant Hernandez's nomination papers;
5. Enjoin Defendants, and all persons acting in concert with them, from printing, certifying, or placing Defendant Hernandez's name on the ballot for the 2026 Democratic primary election for Arizona State Senate, Legislative District 20;
6. If ballots have already been prepared, order the appropriate election officials to remove Defendant Hernandez's name to the extent practicable and lawful, or otherwise not count or certify votes cast for her;
7. Award Plaintiff such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.

XII. VERIFICATION

I, Rocque A. Perez II, declare under penalty of perjury that I am the Plaintiff in this action, that I have read the foregoing Verified Complaint, and that the factual allegations contained therein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
